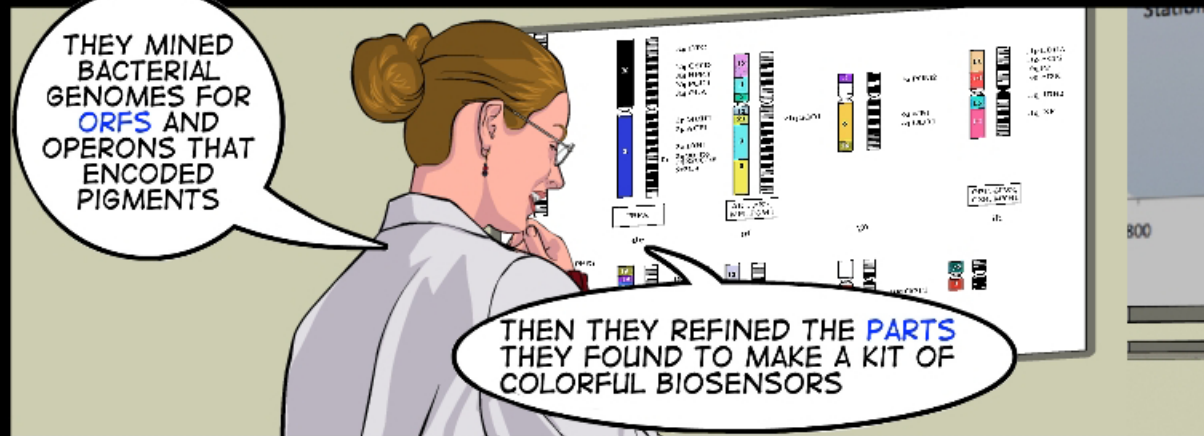
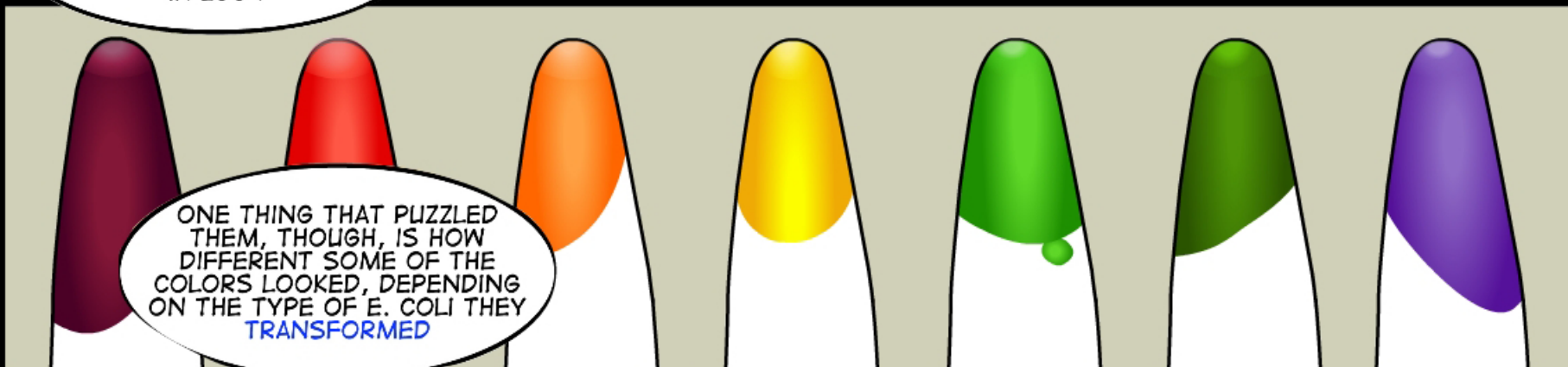


THE UNIVERSITY OF CAMBRIDGE WENT HOME WITH THE WINNING **IGEM** PROJECT IN 2009

THEN THEY REFINED THE **PARTS** THEY FOUND TO MAKE A KIT OF COLORFUL BIOSENSORS

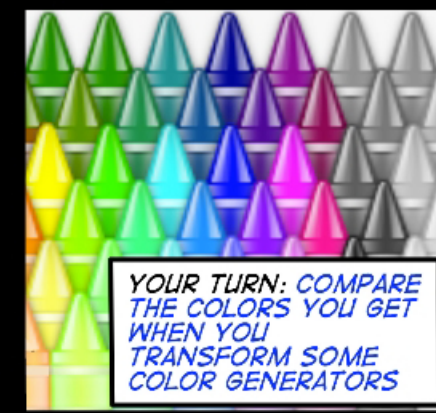
